## What is it?

The 43rd annual Southwest Liturgical Conference Study Week will take place from Tuesday, January 18 through Friday, January 21, 2005 at the Adam's Mark Hotel in downtown Dallas. The Diocesan Liturgy Office is hosting this event.

Begun during the Second Vatican Council, the Southwest Liturgical Conference (SWLC) consists of 26 dioceses from a seven state region and is the oldest, continuous regional liturgical conference in the United States. Each January, the SWLC study week is hosted by a different diocese in the region, highlighting the rich diversity of its people. Dallas was the first diocese to host this event in 1963. In 1984, we stepped up to the challenge once more and, in January 2005, we will again offer our Texas hospitality to the Conference.

Liturgists and those involved in ministry will gather together during this time to study and prayerfully celebrate the ritual nature of the tradition of our Catholic faith. Over 1,200 participants from all over the United States are expected to attend, with the addition of over 800 local Catholic School teachers on Friday. During the week, resource presentations will be given by the Institute of Liturgical Ministry, Resources for Christian Living, the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Music from GIA Publications, Inc., Oregon Catholic Press and World Library Publications will also be showcased. With these events, a keynote address, six major address sessions and a multitude of workshops covering different aspects of ministry, there are 93 total educational opportunities available.

We highly encourage all priests, deacons, religious, Eucharistic ministers, lectors, ushers, catechists, music ministers, musicians and any others who work in parishes to attend. This study week offers both paid staff and faithful volunteers opportunities to pray, sing, study and network. Everyone is invited to *Come to the Feast / Ven al Banquete*. By our baptism we are *Disciples: Called, Fed and Sent Forth*.
